Day One  <b>Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> September</b>	Petite Palace Mayor  Mayor, 46, 01 Centro, Madrid	5pm meet in Foyer of Plaza Mayor  Welcome and briefing. Briefing go through the Camino Trek daily procedures and safety processes. Dinner together then a walk to the plaza Mayor.
Day Two  Monday 9 <sup>th</sup> September	Albergue Camino Y Legenda  Camino Santiago SN, Trabadelo	Madrid to Ponferrada ...Approx (5 Hrs including break). By mini bus 400km approx.  Early wake up, pack bags, transfer baggage into mini buses (bus departure time to be advised). The group will stop for Breakfast along the way. Castle tour and sightseeing to Trabadelo and overnight. Preparation to walk.
Day Three  Tuesday 10 <sup>th</sup> September	Casa Pazos  Avenida De Castilla 1.  Piedrafita	Walk 18.7 km Trabadelo to O'Cebriero  This is the most strenuous and demanding of your whole pilgrimage the 600m climb is rewarding with stunning views along the Valcare valley 1300m above sea level. Enjoy the delight of the O'Cebriero village, one of the highlights of the Camino due to its unique Celtic flavour.
Day Four  Wednesday 11 <sup>th</sup> September	Pension Albergue Lemos  Avenida de Castilla 24, Triacastela	Walk 20.7km O'Cebriero to Tricastella  The Camino descends from the mountains through a number of small valleys with outstanding views. Tricastella is the town of three castles.

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Day Five Thursday 12 <sup>th</sup> September	Albergue Casa Don Alvaro Mayor, 10, Sarria,	Walk 18.7km Tricastella to Sarria Walk  (the scenic route via San X!!) This is the northern direct route. There are some incline Sections, but the views are worth it
Day Six Friday 13 <sup>th</sup> September	Pension Portomino Camino del Monte s/n, Portomarin	Walk 22km Sarria to Portormorin  The route today follows lovely woodland paths and tracks to reach the cobbled streets and churches of Portormarin. At the end of today enjoy the local wine and tapas.
Day Seven Saturday 14 <sup>th</sup> September	Pension Casa Curro Avda de Orense 15 15, Palas De Rei	Walk 24.8km Potormarin to Palas De Rei  The walk today is though the rolling green hills of Galicia.  The history of Palas de Rei is closely linked with military history which is why it retains many achaeological remains.
Day Eight Sunday 15 <sup>th</sup> September	Albergue O Santo Rua Xose Neira Vilas 4, Arzua	Walk 28.8km Palas de Rei to Azura  Today you cross 6 shallow river valleys and then through delightful woodland. Melide is a great stop today to sample the renowned octopus pulpo Gallega.

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<p>Day Nine</p> <p>Monday 16<sup>th</sup> September</p>	<p>Pension A Solaina</p> <p>Rua do Picon, Poral 1, n 03, 1oC, O Pedrouza</p>	<p>Walk 22.8km Azura to O Pedrouza</p> <p>This is a very pleasant walk taking you past sturdy oak trees and into lush meadows. The passport that we carry and get stamped gives you access to a de Compostela certificate that acknowledges you have walked the Camino.</p>
<p>Day Ten</p> <p>Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> September</p>	<p>Exe Area Central</p> <p>Rua Paris, 7, Centro Comercial Area Central, Santiago de Compostela</p>	<p>Walk 19.8, O Pedrouza to Santiago</p> <p>This is a very exciting day, we are reaching the pinnacle of the Adventure. Photos are to be had at the 'Mount of Joy 'of Monte del Gozo. Here you will catch the impressive spires of the Santiago de Compostela Cathedral. The final walk takes you through the beautiful streets of Santiago to view the historical buildings.</p>
<p>Day Eleven</p> <p>Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> September</p>	<p>Hotel Mariquito</p> <p>Santa Catalina, 42 – 44, Finisterre</p>	<p>This is a unique opportunity to the Ourspirit package</p> <p>A trip to Finesterre was known as the end of the world in the middle ages. It held special physical and spiritual significance to pilgrims. This short 1 hr bus trip will take you to the finest seafood restaurants and then a 3km walk along the point to see the sunset. It is a lovely way to finish your Camino and only one third of all trekkers actually make it here.</p>
